A BEGINNING FILLED WITH ALLĀH'S MERCY AND BARAKAH: THE THREE BLESSED MONTHS

Some days are extra special for Muslims. In some Muslim countries, the consecutive three months, Rajab al-Sharīf, Sha'bān al-Sharīf, and Ramaḍān al-Sharīf are called the **“Blessed Three Months.”** They hold a special place in our lives. We look forward to these months with excitement.

Our beloved Prophet Muhammad (sallallāhu alayhi wa sallam) worshipped a lot during these months, fasted many days, and encouraged us to do the same. There are four special nights in these months, namely, the Night of Raghāib, the Night of Mi'rāj, the Night of Barā'ah, and the Night of Qadr.

The month of **Rajab al-Sharīf** is like starting fresh—a chance to stop bad habits and do good deeds. **Sha'bān al-Sharīf** is a month full of barakah and forgiveness. **Ramaḍān al-Sharīf** is the most virtuous month. In Ramaḍān, we fast, pray the Tarāwīh Salāh, and share iftār and sahūr. Fasting in Ramaḍān is one of the five pillars of Islam.

Rajab is like planting seeds, Sha'bān is like watering them, and Ramaḍān is like harvesting the crops. These months remind us to love, help each other, and make lots of duā. From a young age, we should try to follow Allāh's teachings and show kindness. Let's make these months special by supporting one another and doing good deeds.

IBĀDAH AND CLEANLINESS: ALWAYS TOGETHER

Islam holds cleanliness at utmost importance. For ibādah (worship) to be accepted by Allāh Subhānahū, we must follow certain rules, including staying clean both physically and spiritually. Physical cleanliness and spiritual cleanliness go hand in hand. Just as we clean our bodies from dirt, we must also clean our hearts from bad feelings like backbiting and tale-bearing.

Just like dirt on the body can cause illness, bad thoughts and feelings can bring spiritual illnesses for the heart. When we take care of both types of cleanliness, we can earn the pleasure of Allāh Ta‘ālā.

Physical cleanliness is washing your body, keeping your clothes clean, and making sure your surroundings are tidy. They are basic conditions for many ibādahs. Similarly, **spiritual cleanliness** includes having good intentions, wishing for good for others just like you wish for yourself, avoiding evil acts such as shirk (associating others with Allāh), wrongdoing, and hasad (envy). When both cleanliness is maintained, it becomes possible for people to live peacefully together. All the ibādah that Allāh Subhānahū orders us to do help us stay clean both internally and externally.
